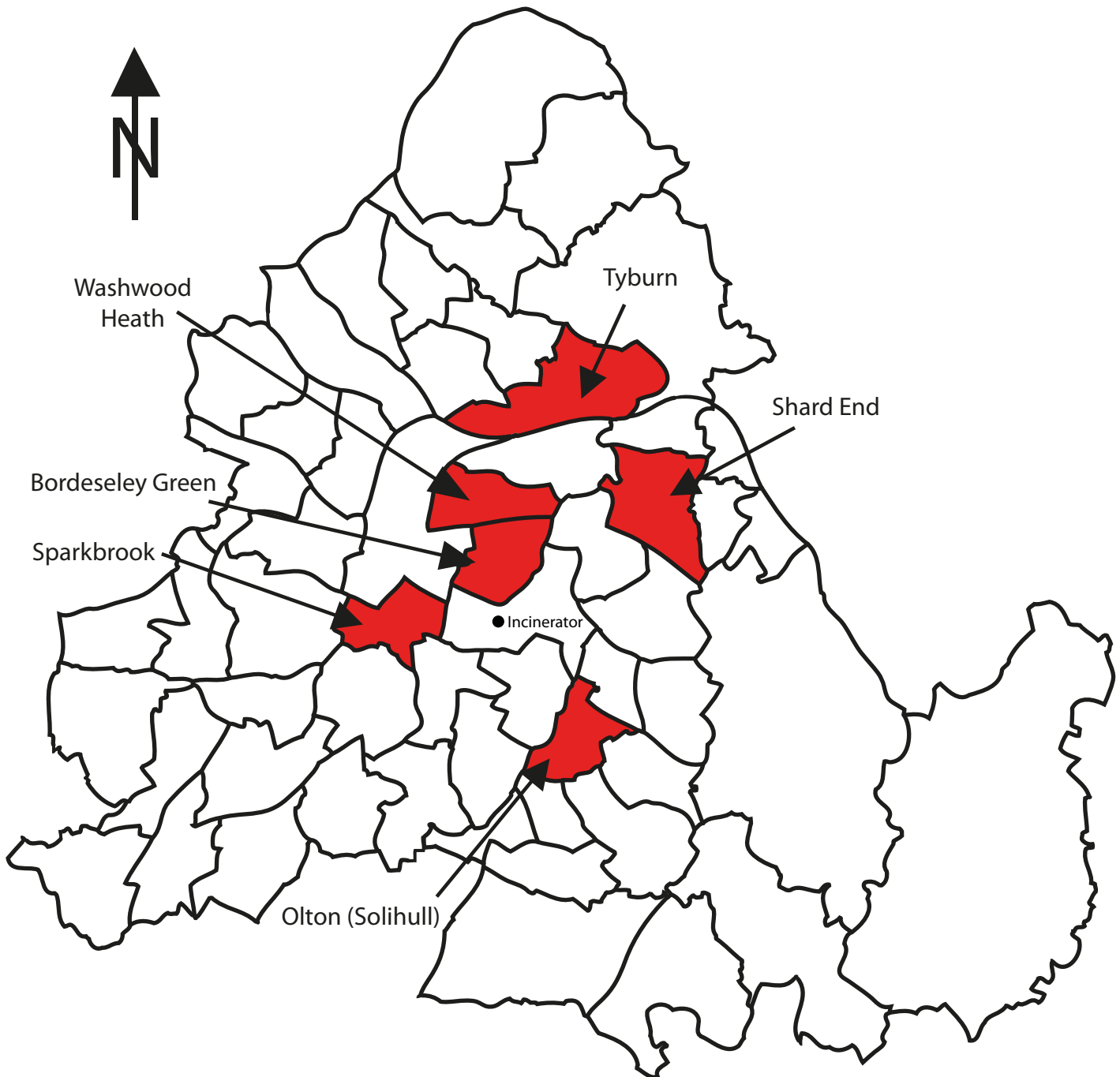


Birmingham & Solihull electoral wards with infant death rates of 10.0 per 1,000 live births and above are clustered around Tyseley incinerator (2004-2009 ONS data) while Dept of Health and Health Protection Agency fail to examine relevant data.



"The Department (of Health) has made no recent assessments of the effect on public health of emissions from incinerators, or the effects on infant mortality." (Hansard, 30 November 2009: Column 539W)
